Classis Huron Corner

- The delegates of Classis Huron, or regional assembly, met on Wednesday, February 26, 2024, at the Palmerston CRC after a one-week delay because of the weather.
- Opening devotions were led by Rev. Craig Hoekema, the pastor of Bethel CRC in Acton.
- A sharing /prayer Round-Table session was led by Rev. Sid Couperus.
- The chair of the meeting was Rev. Victor Laarman, pastor of Collingwood CRC.
- Pastor Sara DeMoor and Peter Schuurman presented an exciting report on the work among the University of Guelph students.
- Various appointments were made, including the election of delegates to Synod 2025, the denominational annual assembly, that is to be held at Redeemer University in Ancaster.
 - Delegates are Rev. Ray Vander Kooij (Clinton CRC), Rev. Jason Crossen (Exeter) with Rev. Cameron Oegema (Listowel) as alternate.
 - Also Elders John Tamming (Owen Sound) and Rich Vandonkersgoed (Listowel), with Richard Golby (Collingwood) as alternate.
- At his own request, pastor Toyosi Awesu was honorably released from the office of Commissioned Pastor in Classis Huron. He was granted a license to exhort instead.
- Classis decided to schedule the examination of Joshua Sweetman for a license to exhort at the May session of classis
- Wilma Hiemstra informed classis that she is retiring and is not renewing her license to exhort.
- Mary Blydorp reported on the work of Diaconal Ministries Canada and the classical diaconal committee.
- Various classical ministries reported, including Safe Church and the Classis Huron Mission Team, that reintroducing a Creative Outreach Venture Fund for churches.

- Len Bakelaar showed a video from the Disability Concerns committee.
- During lunch, the deacons gathered for a deacons' conversation.
- Classis granted the request of the Vanastra Community Church, and the recommendation of the Church Visitors, to release their pastor, Rev. Robert Hoekstra, from ministry at their church.
 The Synodical Deputies (representing synod) concurred with classis' decision.
- Two overtures, formal written proposals sent from churches to classis, were defeated.
- Pastor Victor was thanked for his excellent leadership during the day.
- Classis adjourned at 5:05 PM.
