Classis Huron Corner

- The delegates of Classis Huron (regional assembly) met on Thursday, February 19, 2026, at the Drayton CRC after a one-day delay because of the weather.
- Opening devotions were led by Rev. Wes Collins, the pastor of Drayton CRC.
- Rev. Sid Couperus (First CRC, Owen Sound) and Joan Brady (Classis Huron Mission Catalyst) led a sharing /prayer Round-Table session with a focus on *neighboring*.
- The chair of the meeting was Rev. Martin Dam, pastor of the Stratford CRC.
- Classis received several classical reports:
- Joan Brady reported for the Classis Huron Mission Team. As Mission Catalyst, she is working with a number of individual churches in our classis. She is also involved in the hiring process of the Youth Ministry Coordinator.
- Rev. Carel Geleynse reported for Safe Church and promoted the Inter-Classis Safe Church conference that is scheduled for March 7, 2026.
- Pastor Sara DeMoor presented an exciting report on the work among the University of Guelph students.
- Classis was updated on the search process of the pastoral vacant churches in the classis.
- Classis also received several reports from denominationally related agencies and ministries:
- Representatives from World Renew, Redeemer University, the Canadian National Gathering, Diaconal Ministries Canada and the Council of Delegates (the governing board of the Christian Reformed Church) brought their reports, including a video from Thrive.
- Classis made various decisions...
- An overture (formal written proposal) from Drayton CRC, to approve the release of Rev. Duane VanderLaan from his active ministerial service with the Drayton Reformed Church, was tabled to the May session of classis.
- Classis agreed that the position description submitted by Water Street CRC for a commissioned pastor's position is in keeping with the requirements of Church Order Article 23. The synodical deputies concurred. A classical examination of Josh Sweetman is scheduled for the May session.

- Mr. Jan Oorebeek (Orangeville CRC) was examined and granted a one-year license to exhort in the churches of Classis Huron.
- Classis acknowledged that Rev. William Steele can no longer be a CRC minister, as he is not a member of the CRC anymore.
- A motion that classis follows the decision of synod, affirming the Covenant for Office Bearers at every classis meeting, was tabled to a later classis meeting.
- ...and made several appointments:
- Delegates to Synod 2026, the denominational annual assembly, are:
Rev. Cameron Oegema (Bethel CRC, Listowel) and Rev. Jason Crossen (Exeter CRC) with Rev. Nick Bierma (Stratford CRC) as alternate.
Elders Mr. Wilmar Bakker (Bethel CRC, Listowel) and Mr. Jim Broekema (Orangeville), with Mr. Jonathan Barnhoorn (Palmerston CRC) as alternate.
- Sharon Van Kampen (Bethel, Listowel CRC) was elected as alternate stated clerk.
Jane Vander Velden was thanked for her five years of service as the alternate stated clerk.
- During lunch, the deacons gathered for a deacons' conversation.
- It was announced that Rev. Victor Laarman (Collingwood) accepted a call to Stratford East CRC.
- Pastor Martin was thanked for his excellent leadership during the day.
- Classis adjourned at 4:25 PM.
