Classis Huron Corner.

- The delegates of Classis Huron (regional assembly) met on Wednesday, May 20, 2026, at the Bethel CRC, in Acton.
- Rev. Craig Hoekema, the pastor of Bethel CRC, opened with devotions.
- Rev. Sid Couperus (Classis Huron Prayer Catalyst) and Joan Brady (Classis Huron Mission Catalyst) led a sharing /prayer Round-Table session with a focus on *authentic community*.
- The chair of the meeting was Rev. Bart Eisen, pastor of Maitland River Community Church in Wingham.

Classis made various decisions...

- Josh Sweetman of Water Street CRC, Guelph, was, after an examination, approved for ordination as a Commissioned Pastor.
- Classis approved the release of Rev. Duane VanderLaan, an ordained CRC pastor, from his active ministerial service at Drayton Reformed Church, as per Article 17a of the CRC Church Order. He was declared eligible to receive a call.
- Classis discussed the frequency of classical appointments to pastoral vacant churches.

Classis received several reports...

- Rev. Melissa Burmaster and Carolyn Kleefman shared about the work at the Waterloo Campus Ministry. This ministry is not only among the students, but also includes the faculty and staff on campus.
- Delegates to synod, which will meet next month, talked about some of the items on the agenda.
- The Classis Huron Mission Team shared about its work, including a planned Moving Forward in Faith Conference next fall and an annual prayer retreat planned for next February.
- Sharon Buisman (elder of New Life, Guelph) talked about refugee sponsorship in Guelph. Mary Blydorp reported on the work of Diaconal Ministries Canada.
- Rev. Carel Geleynse (Classis Huron Safe Church Coordinator) presented the Safe Church report. He is reviewing the Classis Huron Safe Church Policy.
- River City Church in Cambridge and Waterloo CRC informed classis that they are regrettably in the process of disaffiliation from the Christian Reformed Church.
- Two Church Visitors' reports were presented.
- Maynard Wiersma, director of Christian Stewardship Services, reported on the work of CSS.
- Classis also received denominational updates. Peter Meerveld talked about the structure of our denomination, while Roshani Morton used a potluck to explain the funding of the various denominational ministries.

Classis made appointments...

- Classis appointed Grace Emma Bierma to the position of Youth Ministry Consultant of Classis Huron. She will be working with the youth ministry leaders in the local churches.
- Classis re-elected Rev. Martin Dam (Stratford CRC) as Regional Pastor for a second term.
- Rev. Jay Crossen was nominated to serve as the alternate synodical deputy.
- Rev. Ed Den Haan was re-elected, while Rev. Harry Zantingh and Rev. Jay Crossen were elected to serve as church visitors for three-year terms.
- Classis held its Annual General Meeting in accordance with the Canadian Corporation Act.
- Pastor Bart was thanked for his excellent leadership during the day.
- Classis adjourned at 4:26 PM.
