

Classis Huron Corner

- The delegates of Classis Huron (regional assembly of 21 churches), met on Wednesday, September 24, 2025, at Stratford CRC.
- Opening devotions were led by Rev. Zach King, the General Secretary of the denomination.
- A sharing /prayer "Round-Table" session was led by Joan Brady and Rev. Sid Couperus.
- The chair of the meeting was Rev. Cam Oegema, co-pastor at Bethel CRC, Listowel.
- In the morning classis conducted a colloquium doctum, a conversation between classis and a minister about his doctrine and life. Rev. Ken Labbé, an RCA-ordained pastor, who has been serving Palmerston CRC for several years, was declared eligible for a call to serve as a CRC ordained pastor.
- In the afternoon classis was privileged to examine two candidates, who were both approved to serve as ordained ministers of the Word in the CRC.
 - Rev. Melissa Burmaster was called to serve as campus minister in Waterloo; Rev. Raymond Evans accepted a call to serve the Lucknow Community CRC.
- A number of members of Community CRC, Kitchener, requested Classis to acknowledge Cornerstone CRC as a new emerging church. Classis was not yet ready to acknowledge Cornerstone CRC. Instead, classis chose to look into measures to promote healing between the members of Cornerstone CRC and Community CRC.
- Classis received several denominational reports: Rev. Beth Fellinger reported on the work of Resonate, Mr. Paul Vandersteen on Reframe Ministries and Mr. Mark Vanderwees on Diaconal Ministries Canada.
- Classis approved the creation of a Youth Ministry Consultant position. Once this position is filled, this consultant will serve to equip and support the local youth ministry leaders.
- Classis approved the request from the Exeter CRC for the retirement of Rev. Kevin teBrake.
- Classis also approved the 2026 Classis Huron Budget.
- Several classical ministries reported: the Classical Ministerial Leadership Team reported that they are supporting
 and encouraging 6 seminary students. The Safe Church Coordinator brought a brief report. Classical Counsellors
 reported on the minister-search progress of seven churches.
- The delegates to Synod 2025 shared about their positive experiences and about some of the decisions synod made in June.
- Pastor Cam was thanked for his excellent leadership during the day.
- Classis adjourned at 6:40 PM.
